We continue as God's people our journeys of lent. It is in this holy season that we prepare ourselves for the celebrations of Holy Week. I encourage all of God's people to stay steadfast in the Lenten season. The temptation is to grow tired of doing our acts of penance and to give them up and go back to where we were before Ash Wednesday. Stay faithful and trust in the Lord!

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. We hear in the Scriptures how the people welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem with shouts of joy. Palm branches were spread on the path Jesus would take as he entered the holy city. It is a lesson in human nature as those who welcomed him with such joy and hope would be some of the same voices who would a few days later be shouting "Crucify Him."

As you come into Church for Palm Sunday I invite you to take a palm branch. We will begin the mass by blessing the palms held up by God's people. The Processional Gospel will then be read before we join in singing the processional song. The Passion of the Lord according to St. Luke will be read in parts and the congregation will take the part of the crowd. (Next week will be a little bit about Holy Thursday and Good Friday) **Fr. School Update...

Greetings from Kindergarten at St. Casimir's School! Spring is almost here, and the kids are excited for warmer weather! Time is moving so fast and with that has come a lot of learning!

In Math and Science the students have been learning about measurement. For kindergarteners, it is all about hands on experiences with connecting cubes to measure length and height as well as weight. The vocabulary words they have been learning that accompany this learning unit are shorter and taller, shorter and longer, and heavier and lighter. Using a balance scale to measure weight was a hit with the kids, and they enjoyed predicting which items were heavier and lighter. Predicting was another vocabulary word that was introduced to the kids. After a few examples, the kids have become pros at predicting!

In Reading and Language Arts the kids have been learning about digraphs which are two consonants that make one sound as in sh, ck, ch, and wh just to name a few. It is incredible how much the kids are able to read by understanding digraphs. The kids are also getting more experience with answering comprehension questions at the end of a story. They are writing complete sentences using a capital letter to start a sentence and using a punctuation mark at the end of a sentence.

We hope you are enjoying the warmer weather and are looking forward to spring as much as our class is! Blessings! --Submitted by Beth Emerson, SCS Classroom Teacher
