School update....

If you were a mouse in the corner at St. Casimir's School, what would you have heard over the last six weeks?

If you had joined us at morning prayer, you would have heard the student body singing their weekly psalm, as they signed God's Holy Word in American Sign Language. You would hear them sharing how they pray, give and give up during Lent so they can walk closer to Jesus

If you had witnessed a music class with the preschoolers, you would have seen them gathered around a big bass drum pounding out rhythms saying "Lent means Spring. Lent means Spring."

If you had visited the kindergarten, first and second grade art class you would have heard them talking about Passover and how the Hebrews were saved by the blood of the lamb and how we are saved by the blood of Jesus. our Lamb of God.

You would have observed one student telling me, "You can't have two u's next to each other," when they were learning how to spell Triduum. I explained that Triduum was a Latin word.

Fourth grade was hearing about the Triduum and learned that they won't hear the final blessing signifying Mass is over on Holy Thursday or Good Friday because the Triduum celebration lasts for three days and ends with the Easter Vigil Mass.

The fifth and sixth grade were preparing to give timed speeches and avoiding the "ah"s and "um"s that happen so easily. For their speech topics, they chose either Holy Thursday, Good Friday or the Easter Vigil.

All of the kindergarten through sixth grade students have been working diligently on the Living Stations of the Cross. Having kindergarten students memorize parts is awe inspiring. We often stopped rehearsals to remind ourselves of the reason we are presenting the Living Stations--for the Glory of God. The students presented the Stations to the school and parish community on Tuesday, April 12th, at 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. May you all have a Holy Easter Season as we each bring glory to God with our lives.
