



#### From Fr. Havel...

The Pharisees tried to trip up Jesus with his speech. They thought they had developed the perfect plan. Was it right to pay taxes? This is the question they brought to the Lord. If he said yes, pay the tax, then the people would be angry because the Romans were an invading army. If he said no, don't pay the tax, then the Roman army would arrest him for inciting the people against them. Jesus, however, would not fall into their trap. Recognizing that the coins they used were Roman with Caesar's image and inscription, he responded, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and give to God what belongs to God."

What belongs to God is ourselves! Our love, our gratitude, our salvation. We often worry more about the things of this world than the things of God and our eternal life. The Gospel calls us to recommit ourselves to the Lord. Put God first in our lives and to trust always in God's love and faithfulness. Things of this world change very quickly but the love of God for us is forever.
