Since November 12, the world of distance learning has been navigated by the staff, students and parents of St. Casimir's School, and we have made a great team. During these first two weeks of distance learning we have utilized technology for all things educational, and Zoom calls have become our new way of being together. While it has had its challenges, it has been so much fun seeing the kids in a different way.

I have come up with a couple of challenges for the students, to help them stay creative and entertained during their day at home. The first challenge consisted of making the tallest tower they could with different materials around the house. It was a delight seeing their imagination at work. I saw towers made of toilet paper, blocks and even pillows and blankets. This week's challenge was making a fort, I can't wait to see what the students create.

In Language Arts we are discussing informational text, cause and effect, singular and plural nouns and patterns in nature. The second graders have been learning about money in Math and all that it entails, while the third graders have been learning different methods of adding and subtracting.

As always, Science during these two weeks has been fun for students. They were able to come up with ideas for making a bird house with materials they already had at home. They also learned about different types of frogs. This week they are learning how seeds migrate, and they even got to make a rotocopter and a glider to simulate how seeds get away from the momma plant.

Distance learning has its challenges, but I am so grateful for all the work we have done together to make this adventure a success. The St. Casimir's family has really come together to make the most out of this phase.
