#### A Word from Fr. Havel...

The Transfiguration of Jesus that we hear in our Gospel reading this week gives us a glimpse into Heaven. Jesus was transfigured before Peter, James, and John and we are told, "his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light." Moses and Elijah, the lawgiver and the prophet, both of whom lived hundreds of years before Jesus, came and talked with Jesus. Given this glimpse of eternal life and the heavenly form the Apostles would later recall what they had seen and their message would give hope to others who had experienced the death of Jesus on the cross. Their witness would bring light to the darkness of the disciple's grief. May our faith in God's love and mercy bring hope to those who walk in darkness in our world today.

#### Liturgy Changes:

This week priests of our diocese received word from Bishop Quinn that with the presence of the Coronavirus in our world and country, changes in our celebrations of the Mass should be enacted. These changes are:

- 1.) Communion from the cup (Blood of Christ) should be suspended.
- 2.) Shaking of hands at the sign of peace should be suspended.
- 3.) Hand sanitizers will be available at the entrances of the church. Bishop Quinn also wants us to remind everyone that if you are feeling ill the Mass is televised on TV.
